

Introduction

Thank you for purchasing an Endura EVC in-vehicle charger. This rugged product features advanced charging technology and is designed for rapid charging two-way radio batteries from a 12V – 24V source in a vehicle. EVC models are radio specific and provide a precision fit with the battery. The model you have purchased will charge Li-Ion / LiPo batteries only or Li-Ion, LiPo and NiMH batteries based on the batteries available for your radio. 
Important

1. Read all **Caution** statements below and this User Manual before attempting to install the EVC or charge a battery.
2. Check to make sure the EVC model is compatible with your radio battery and battery chemistry before installing.
3. Always charge new batteries completely before initial use. Recycle batteries when they can no longer be used.
4. For best performance, charge NiCd and NiMH batteries when they are fully discharged.

Caution

1. Do not charge a battery unless it is designed with overcharge protection.
2. Do not discard unwanted batteries in the trash or incinerate. Batteries exposed to fire or excessive heat may explode.
3. Install the EVC where it will be protected from rain or moisture.
4. Make sure contacts on the radio holder and battery are clean. Do not allow wire or metal objects to touch the contacts.†
5. Do not open or make any modifications to the EVC. Use only the DC power cable supplied.
6. Always secure the radio (or battery) in the radio holder with the tie-down strap before the vehicle, trailer, or train goes in motion.
7. Make sure that the tie-down strap securely holds the radio or battery, but is not too tight. An over-tensioned strap could cause injury when released.

EVC Features




1. Status LED information.
2. Holes for fastening to dash or mounting bracket (see **Optional Accessories**).
3. Charging contacts.
4. Status LED (radio battery).
5. Tie-down strap.†
6. Retaining hook for connecting tie-down strap.
7. USB charging port and power-on LED.

† Some EVC models have a fabric strap with grommets in place of the elastic cord.

8. Screws and spacers for fastening EVC to vehicle.
9. Connection point for DC power cable.
10. DC power cable (EVC-HW).

Installation

Before installing the EVC, confirm that the model is compatible with the radio battery you want to charge and the battery's chemistry.

1. Select an area in the vehicle to mount the charger. The EVC's compact size allows it to be installed in areas where other in-vehicle chargers will not fit.
2. Run the DC power cable from the charger and connect it to the vehicle's 12V or 24V source. Fully insert the DC cable plug into the connection point on the bottom of the charger.
3. Place the battery in the charger to confirm it will properly charge. If there are no issues, fasten the charger to the vehicle and secure the power cable.
4. Use the 4 screws provided to fasten the EVC to the dash or wall of your vehicle. If needed, place a rubber spacer over each screw on the back side of the charger to help stabilize the unit.
5. The tie down strap is properly sized to secure the radio in the charger. Place the elastic cord over the top of the radio and attach the plastic clip to the retaining hook. When charging a battery only, the tie-down strap can be made tighter by sliding the plastic clip up slightly and pulling the looped end of the elastic strap over the retaining hook.
6. For models with a fabric tie-down strap, attach the grommet to the retaining hook.

Charging A Radio Battery

A battery may be charged while on or off the radio. Always use the tie-down strap to secure the radio or battery before your vehicle is driven.

1. After the EVC is installed, switch vehicle power on and place a battery in the charger. The status LED will illuminate RED continuously to indicate normal charging.
2. If the charge status LED is RED and flashes, a fault has been detected. The flash pattern represents a specific fault condition. If the status LED is ORANGE (solid or flashing), an advisement is being provided. See **Fault Conditions And Advisements** for details.
3. When the battery is charged to 80% of capacity, the charge status LED will change to GREEN and flash. It is recommended that the battery be charged to at least 80% capacity before use. The charge status LED will illuminate GREEN with no flashing when the battery is fully charged.
4. After removing a battery, the status LED will illuminate ORANGE for a few seconds. Allow the status LED to turn off before placing another battery in the EVC.
5. A fully charged battery may be left in the EVC and a full charge will be maintained. This maintenance feature will not damage the battery.

Charging A Radio Battery (continued)

6. The EVC will charge a battery when its temperature is between 0°C and 45°C. When a battery's temperature is 0°C (32°F) or lower the status bar will be solid ORANGE; when 45°C (113°F) the status LED will flash RED. See **Fault Conditions & Advisements**.

USB Charging Port

1. The USB port can be used for charging mobile phones, tablets, and other small electronic devices.
2. The port is designed to receive a USB Type A connector, has a 5V output, and 2A charge rate. To charge a device, simply connect it to the USB port with a compatible USB cable.
3. The LED above the USB port illuminates RED when the EVC is connected to power and indicates the port has sufficient input voltage to charge your device.

Status LED Summary

LED Color	Status
Solid ORANGE	Cold battery, charger monitoring temperature.*
Flashing ORANGE	Battery cannot be charged, see "Advisements".
Solid RED	Normal battery charging.
Flashing RED	Requires immediate attention, see "Fault Conditions".
Flashing GREEN	Battery charge level approximately 80%.
Solid GREEN	Battery fully charged and in maintenance mode.

*Cold battery detection not available on some EVC models.

Fault Conditions & Advisements

When the status LED flashes RED, a fault condition exists. A fault condition requires immediate attention. When the status LED is solid or flashes ORANGE, you are receiving an advisement about the battery.

The flash patterns for fault conditions are as follows:

LED Pattern	Fault Description
Flashes RED 1 Time	Indicates (A) low voltage battery failure or (B) battery has a short circuit. If (A), the battery's voltage is below the minimum level required and cannot be charged. If (B), the battery is defective and should be recycled. This warning is provided after the pre-charge stage is completed.
Flashes RED 2 Times	Indicates battery contact is "open" and current is not passing through the (+) and (-) contacts on the battery. This warning is provided after the initial diagnostic stage is complete. Check EVC compatibility with your battery.
Flashes RED 3 Times	Battery temperature is 45°C (113° F) or above. Charging has terminated, remove battery from charger. Have battery checked by a qualified technician.

Fault Conditions & Advisements (continued)

The flash patterns for fault conditions are as follows:

LED Pattern	Advisement
Solid ORANGE (Battery removed.)	Brief reset period for charger after battery is removed. Allow the LED to go off before inserting another battery.
Solid ORANGE (Battery inserted.)	Indicates battery is too cold when initially inserted. If the battery temperature is 0°C (32° F) or below, charging is delayed for up to two hours. Battery is monitored and charging resumes once it is above freezing. Monitoring terminates if the battery temperature remains below freezing for two hours.
Flashes ORANGE 1 Time	Battery temperature remains at 0°C (32° F) or below after two hours of monitoring. Remove battery from charger and allow it to warm.
Flashes ORANGE 2 Times	Indicates charging complete, but battery is under charged. Battery voltage is below minimum level required. This warning is provided after the rapid charging stage is complete.

*EVC-BK2 requires 14V / 1A minimum to fully charge radio battery. Input voltage from 12V – 14V will result in the battery being undercharged.
